Dear Colleague!

Thank you so much for you recent letter with regard to the agenda of the new Intergovernmental Conference (IGC). The smooth functioning of the new enlarged European Union is an issue, which we take with the utmost seriousness, and I am very pleased to share my views on the expectations and agenda of the forthcoming IGC.

Lithuania is fully aware of and supports the European Union's aim to ensure the efficient functioning of EU institutions and democratic representation of its citizens. It is this efficiently functioning enlarged EU that Lithuania aspires to join. The Protocol on the Institutions with the Prospect of Enlargement of the European Union of the Amsterdam Treaty did not create foundation for the full enlargement.

Lithuania welcomes the decisions of the Union to keep the Candidate States informed about the proceedings of the IGC, and to invite them to put their points of view on related matters. It is an important step drawing future member states to the decisions that will be significant for the enlarged Union.

We associate that one of the most important goals of the IGC should be a comprehensive institutional reform that would enable the EU to admit all the states involved in the enlargement process as well as to ensure their proper representation. Only the institutional structure that ensures equal rights and fair representation of all the member states will acceptable to the present and future citizens of the Union. We are confident that these issues will be fully reflected in the agenda of the IGC.

Lithuania welcomes the Union's determination to conclude the IGC by the end of 2000 and to ratify the results of the Conference in order to be in a position to welcome new Member States from the end of 2002. It is a vital for maintaining momentum of the enlargement process.
