The European Constitution: Post-referendum survey in France

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This document does not represent the point of view of the European Commission. The interpretations and opinions contained in it are solely those of the authors.

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PRESENTATION

France chose to organise a referendum on the treaty establishing a Constitution for Europe. **The referendum was held on Sunday, 29 May 2005.** The **very high turnout rate of 69.3%** is proof of the interest aroused by the campaign. **The "no" obtained 54.70% of votes cast**, thereby breaking the trend of previous referenda on European construction.¹

The aim of this post-referendum survey, commissioned by Directorate-General Press and Communication of the European Commission, is to gain a better understanding of the reasons why people abstained, what motivated how they voted, the perceived effects of the Constitution and the possible scenarios following what some people have called a "political earthquake".

To that end, EOS Gallup Europe, through its partner institute in France, TNS-Sofres, carried out 2015 interviews **over the two days following the vote**, i.e. on 30 and 31 May, with registered French voters, using the methodology adopted for the Flash Eurobarometer (telephone) surveys.

¹ The referendum of 23 April 1972 on the enlargement of the European Communities to include the United Kingdom, Ireland, Denmark and Norway (which in the end did not ratify its accession) had a turnout rate of 60.2% and produced a "yes" victory, with 68.3% of the votes cast. For the referendum of 20 September 1992 on the ratification of the Maastricht Treaty, 69.7% of registered voters turned out to vote; the result was a "yes" victory, with 51.05% of the votes cast.

1. Turnout in the referendum

This first part of the report analyses the turnout rate for the referendum held on 29 May last in France and more precisely the socio-demographic profile of voters who abstained. The report then focuses on the main reasons why voters abstained, as well as the influence of the level of information of French voters and their opinion on the debates on the Constitution in France.

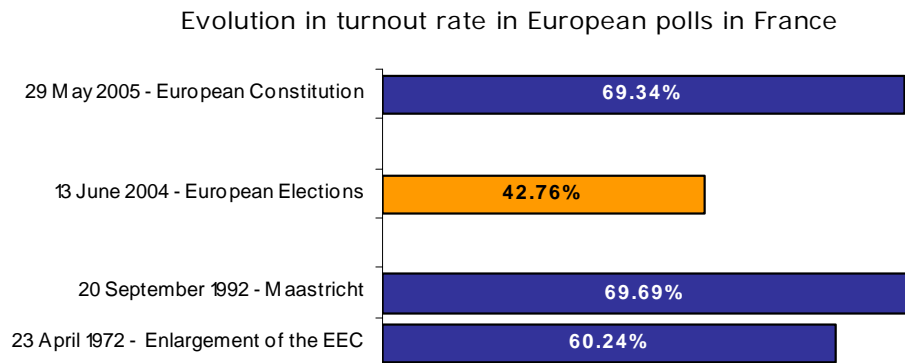
1.1. The turnout rate

- High turnout rate, comparable to that of Maastricht -

A massive 69.3% of voters turned out for this referendum. Several studies have shown how far the referendum campaign, with in particular daily press articles, numerous radio-television debates and several television broadcasts by the President of the Republic, captured the attention of French voters.

By way of comparison, the turnout rate of the two earlier French referenda on a European question was 60.4% in 1972 and 69.7% in 1992. At the European elections in June 2004, the turnout rate was only 42.8%, that is to say the lowest level ever recorded for such elections.



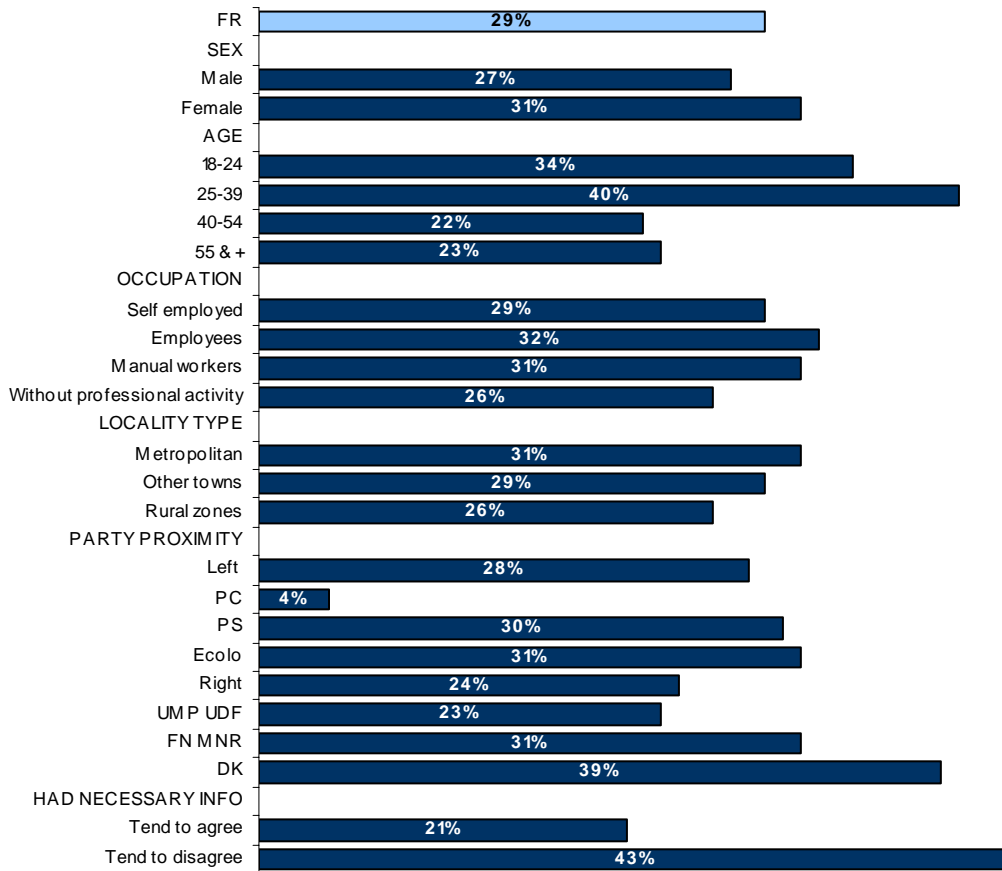
The strong French turnout rate for the referendum on 29 May 2005 means that the frequent analysis of a lack of interest in public consultations needs to be qualified: electoral mobilisation depends above all on how citizens perceive the importance of the issue on which they are asked to vote. For example, in May 2002 during the second round of the French Presidential election, when electors had to choose between Jacques Chirac and Jean-Marie Le Pen, 79.7% of the electorate voted.

The socio-demographic profile of abstaining voters reveals that:

- The highest levels of abstention during this referendum were recorded among French voters aged under 40: 34% of the 18-24 age group and 40% of the 25-39 age group;
- Slightly more women (31%) than men abstained (27%);
- The level of abstention was slightly higher among people living in large urban centres than among people living in rural areas (31% versus 26% respectively);
- Only 4% of voters close to the Communist party abstained, thereby highlighting the very strong mobilisation of that party's supporters;
- The abstention rate was higher among people who claimed that they did not have the necessary information before the referendum to make their decision (43%) than among those who felt that they were sufficiently informed (21%).
- Finally, 51% of voters who abstained during the European elections in June 2004 voted in this referendum, thereby demonstrating that far more people were mobilised by this issue.

1.2. Reasons for abstaining

There were numerous reasons why French citizens abstained, ranging from personal circumstances which prevented voters from turning out, a lack of interest in politics in general or European affairs. We shall examine to what extent these aspects explain the attitude of the part of the electorate that abstained.

- The complexity of the text and lack of information called into question -

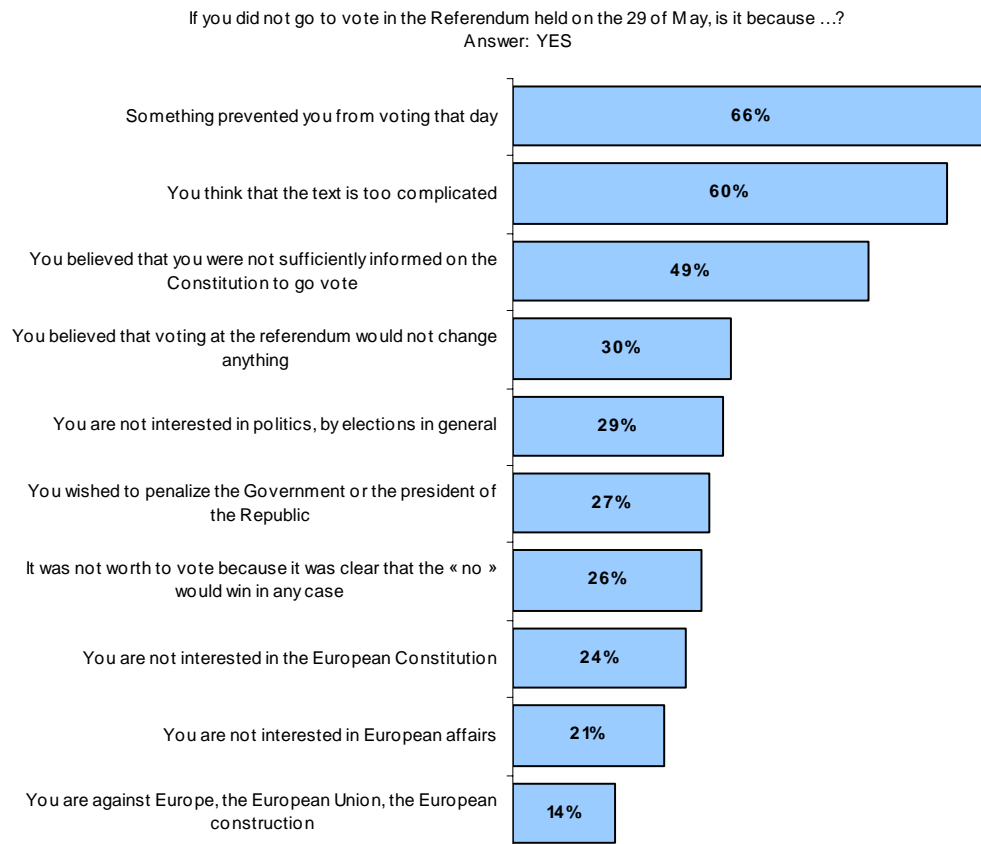
Other than **"something prevented me from voting"** which was mentioned by 66% of voters who abstained on the day of the referendum, the main reason for abstaining noted was the **complexity of the text**, which was mentioned by 60% of the people interviewed. In addition, almost one in two respondents who abstained declared that they did not vote because they did not have **sufficient information** on the European Constitution to participate in the vote (49%).

Moreover, 30% of voters who abstained did so because they believed that **voting at the referendum would not have changed anything**, while 26% believed that there was no point in voting since it was **clear that the "no" vote would win in any case**.

The lack of interest is expressed moreover in other ways, but in far lower proportions: 29% of voters who abstained declared that they are not interested in politics in general, while 24% do not seem to be interested in the European Constitution and 21% in European affairs.

More than a quarter of voters did not turn out on 29 May because they wanted to **penalise the government** or the President of the Republic (27%).

Finally, only 14% of people who did not vote mentioned that they were **against the European Union or European construction to justify their attitude**.



The reason "**something prevented me from voting**" recorded with fairly similar scores in all the socio-professional categories. However, other reasons for abstaining indicate important differences from a socio-demographic point of view.

The complexity of the text seems to have had a slightly more dissuasive effect on young people (66% of those aged 18 to 24, compared with 54% of those aged 55 and over), but above all on manual workers (82%). In addition, 73% of those who abstained and who declared that they did not have sufficient information to make a decision on the date of the referendum gave the complexity of the text as the reason why they abstained.

The lack of information seems to have been a particularly important factor for young people: 75% of those aged 18 to 24 did not vote because they considered that they were not sufficiently informed on the Constitution (compared with 31% of those aged 55 and over, 48% of the 40 to 54 age group and 52% of the 25 to 39 age group). Voters living in rural areas who abstained also more inclined to put the blame on the lack of information (59% compared with 41% of people living in urban areas).

1.3. The role of the level of information

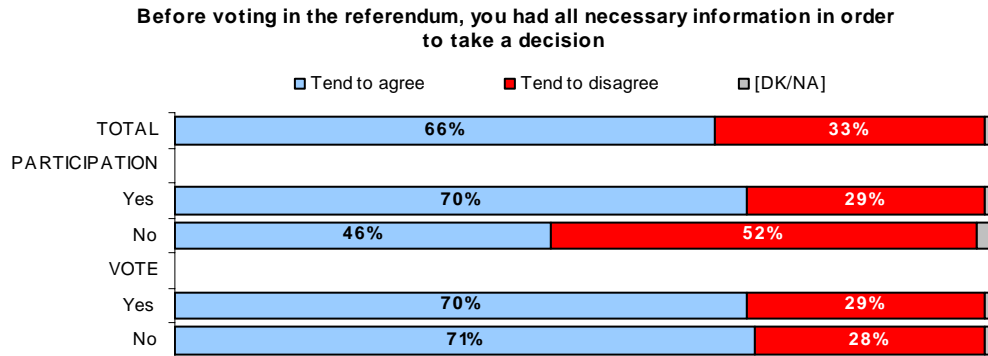

- Lack of information influenced the turnout rate, but not how people voted -

Although, as regards respondents in general, two thirds consider that before voting in the referendum they had sufficient information to make a decision (66%), 70% of the electorate who actually voted felt that they had sufficient information while the corresponding percentage for those who abstained was only 46%.

In other words, more than one in two voters who abstained consider that they did not have enough information to make their mind up how to vote.

On the other hand, the level of information of the "yes" and "no" voters is comparable. In other words, although abstaining is closely correlated to a feeling of a lack of information, there is no such correlation with the "no" vote.



A comparison of the answers to this question and the perception of the time when the debates on the European Constitution began highlights the fact that three quarters of French voters who consider that the debates began at the right time affirm that they had all the necessary information to take a decision on the day of the referendum (75%). In addition, a majority of French citizens who believe that the debates started too late (54%) or too soon (69%) consider nevertheless that they had the necessary information to decide how to vote. However, 45% of citizens who consider that the debates started too late consider that they did not have sufficient information to make a decision.

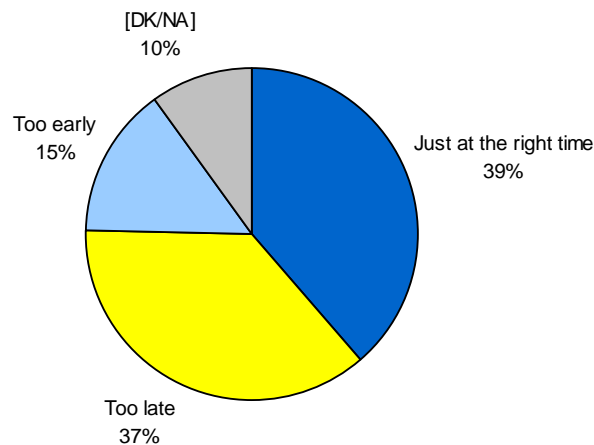
1.4. The debates on the European Constitution

Source questionnaire: Q9

- The debates on the Constitution started at the right time -

Almost four out of ten French citizens believe that the debates on the European Constitution started either at the right time (39%) or too late (37%). Only 15% of the respondents consider that the debates started too soon.

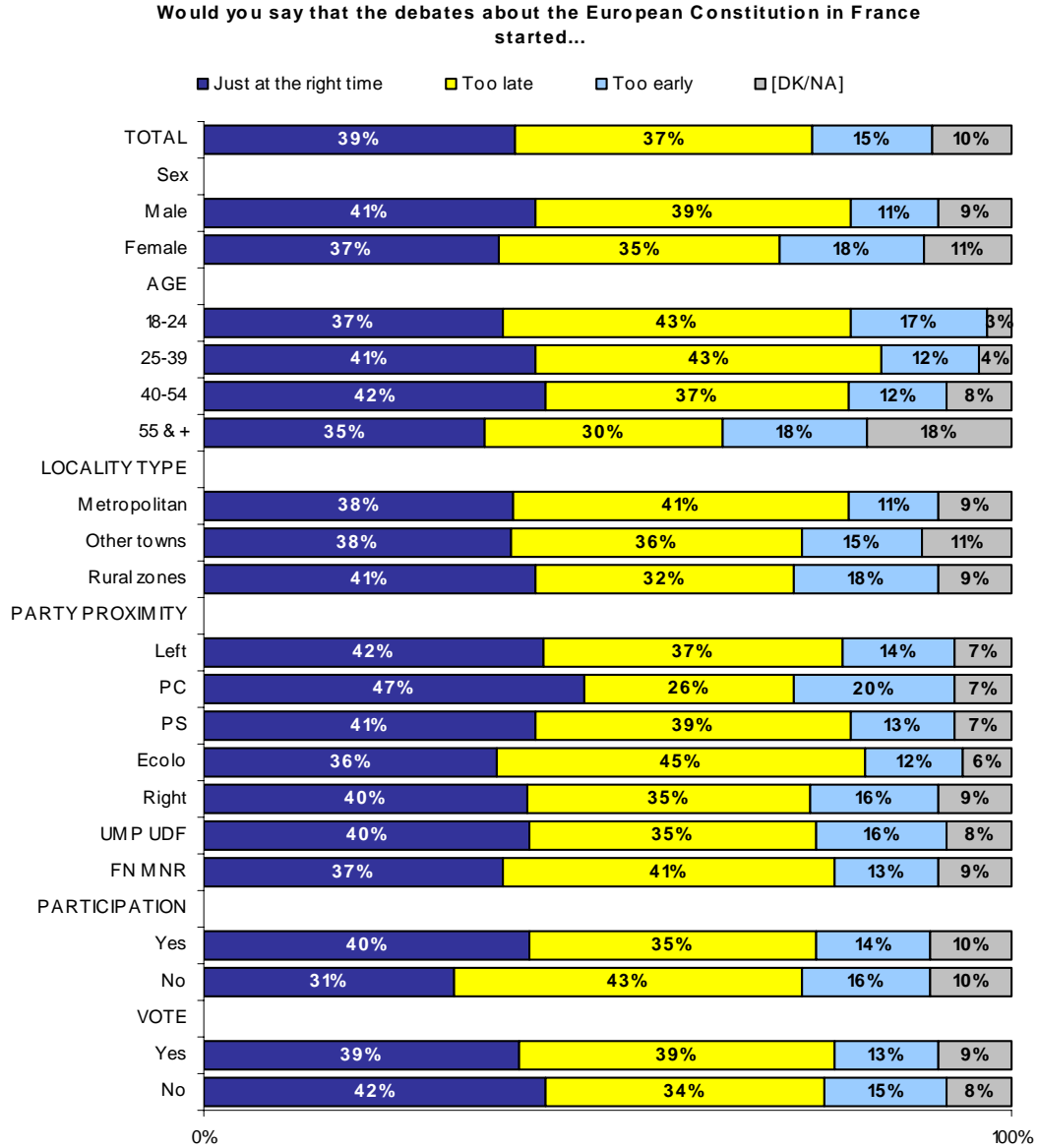
Would you say that the debates about the European Constitution in France started...



From a socio-demographic point of view, the answers to this question reveal the following information:

- Slightly more men (41%) than women (37%) consider that the debates on the European Constitution started at the right time, while more women than men believe that they started too soon (18% versus 11% for men).
- 43% of those aged 18 to 39 consider that the debates started too late (compared with 30% of those aged 55 and over). It should be borne in mind that young people were the main abstainers in the referendum.
- People living in large cities tend to take the view that the debates started too late (41% compared with 32% for people living in rural zones).

- 40% of those who voted consider that the debates started at the right time compared with 31% of people who abstained. The latter tend to be more inclined to consider that the debates on the European Constitution started too late (43% versus 35% of those who turned out to vote).



1.5. When did voters make up their minds on how to vote?

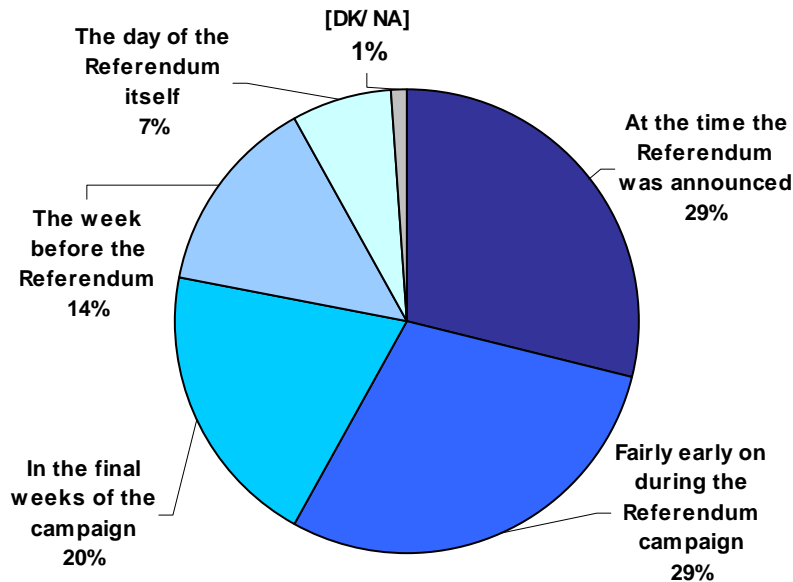
- A choice made after careful consideration -

Part of the French electorate seem to have made up their mind at a fairly early stage on how to vote in the referendum. In fact, 29% of voters knew how they would vote at the time the referendum was announced and 29% declared that they made their mind up at the beginning of the campaign.

Moreover, one in five electors made their decision in the last week before the date of the referendum (20%) and 14% of the electorate made their decision in the final weeks of the campaign. Finally, 7% of voters made their decision on the day of the referendum itself.

Therefore, the referendum campaign seems to have played an important role for a large percentage of voters. If the number of voters who made their choice at the beginning of the campaign is added to that of those who decided in the final weeks of the campaign, and even during the last week of the campaign, and to that of those who waited until the actual day of the referendum, that makes a total of seven out of ten voters.

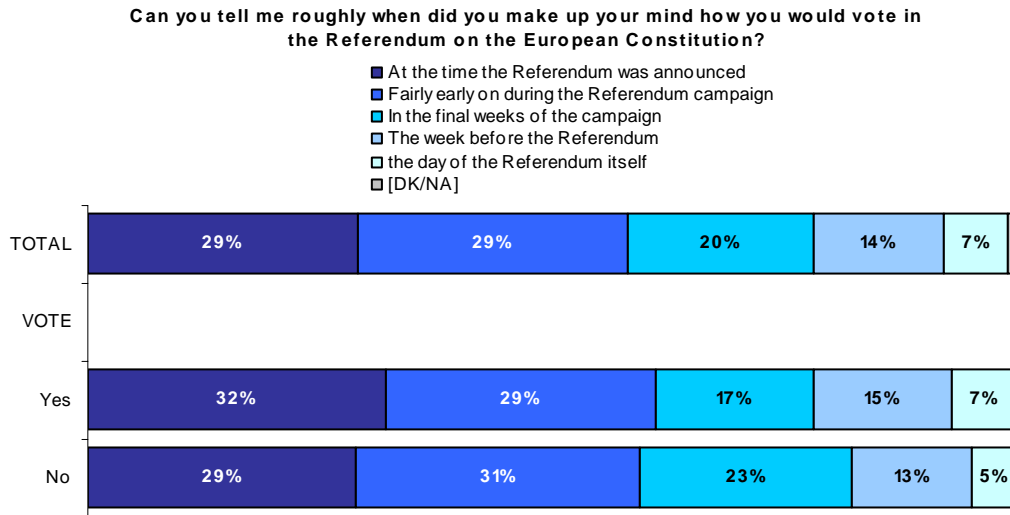
Can you tell me roughly when did you make up your mind how you would vote in the Referendum on the European Constitution?



The chart below shows the point of time at which voters made up their mind on how to vote, broken down according to "yes" and "no" votes at the referendum.

In this regard, there are no significant differences in relation to the way in which people voted.

However, the biggest difference between "yes" voters and "no" voters relates to the last few weeks of the campaign.



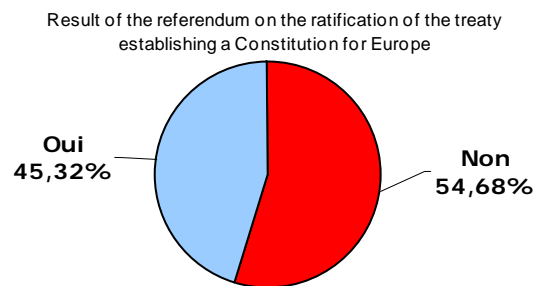
2. The analysis of the result

This part of the report is devoted more specifically to an analysis of the vote itself. It examines the results of the referendum according to the voter's profile, what motivated the electorate to vote "yes" or "no" and finally the key element which determined how people voted.

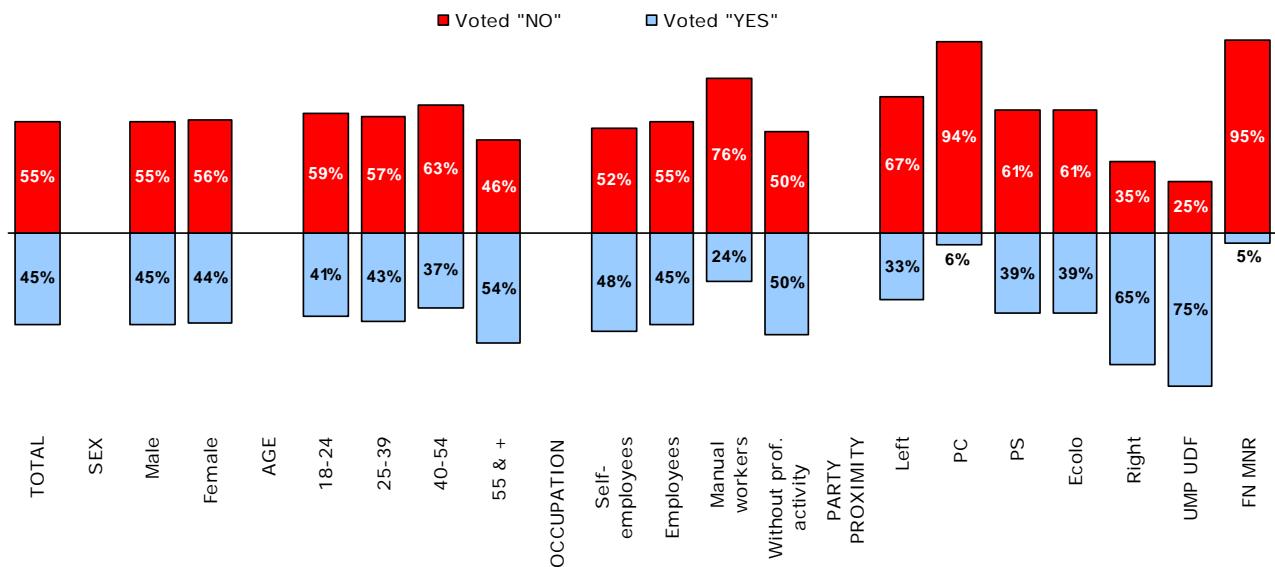
2.1. The vote

The result of the referendum, by which almost 55% of French voters rejected the European Constitution, was in line with the forecasts of the last pre-referendum opinion polls.



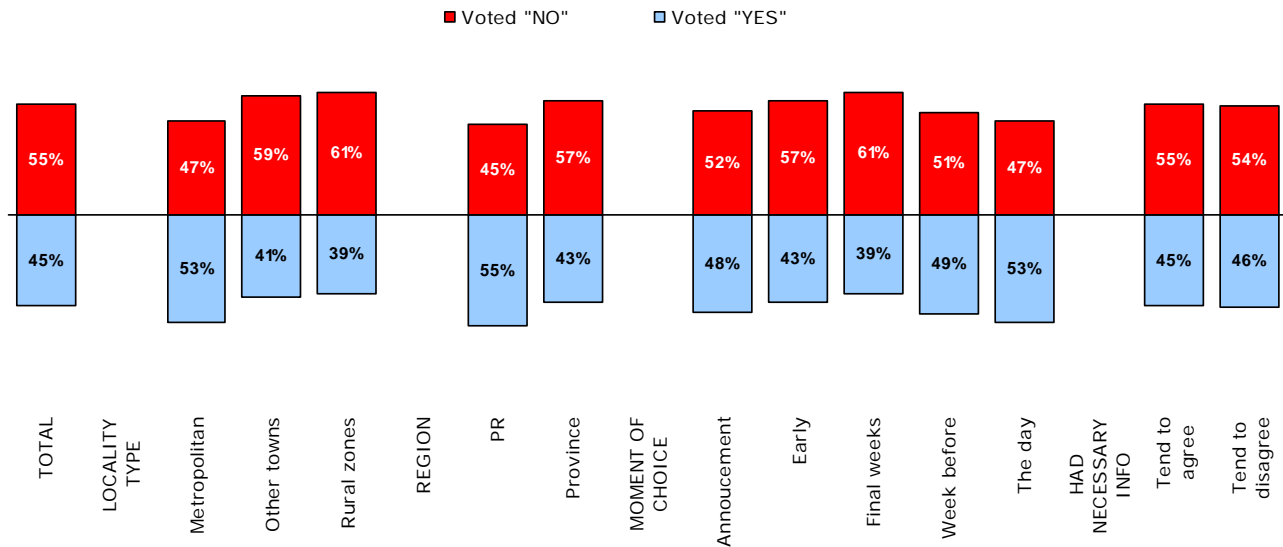
The rejection of the Constitution was particularly strong among the **40 to 54 age group** (63%) and the **18 to 24 age group** (59%), but above all among **manual workers** (76%). It is to be noted, moreover, that almost all the **supporters of the CP and FN/MNR parties** voted against the Constitution (94% and 95% respectively). It would appear that these categories of the population saw the referendum as a way of rallying a majority to their protests, without there being any need to elect representatives from the extreme political parties. Moreover, a large majority of those close to the **SP** (61%) and the **Greens** (61%) also voted against the Constitution and only a quarter of **UMP/UDF** supporters did likewise (25%).



61% of **people living in rural areas** voted against the Constitution compared with 47% of "no" votes in the urban areas. It is also noteworthy that a majority of inhabitants of the Paris region voted "yes" (55%).

People made up their minds on how they would vote during the campaign, in particular during the final weeks of the campaign. As was noted earlier in this report, more "no" voters declared that they made their decision in the final weeks of the referendum campaign (1.5.). That observation is confirmed here since 61% of those who made their decision during the final weeks of the campaigns voted against the Constitution (compared with 39% who voted "yes"). **The floating voters**, who decided on the day of the referendum itself, seem to be mainly in the "yes" camp and rallied to that position at the very end of the campaign.

Finally, the fact that voters did or did not feel that they had **sufficient information** clearly did not play a decisive role. Whether or not voters considered themselves sufficiently informed, they voted in the same way: around 55% for the "no" vote.



2.2. What motivated YES voters

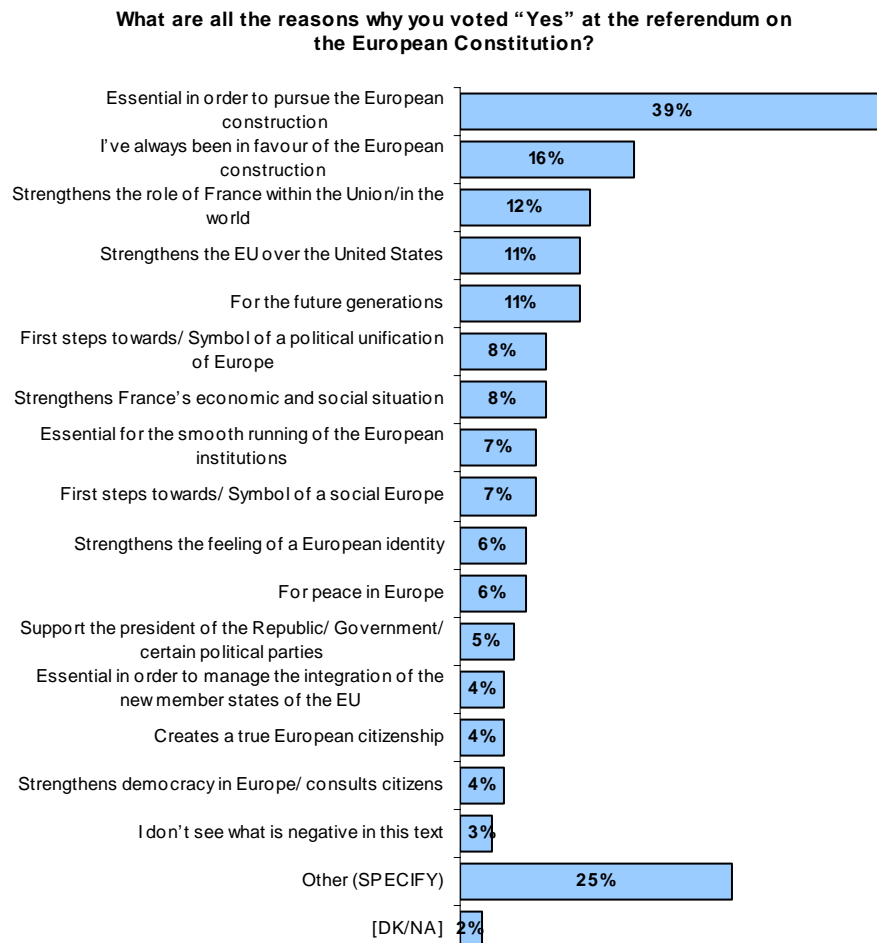

- European construction: the overriding motivation –

The two main reasons given for voting "yes" are based on the essential need to pursue **European construction**: 39% of citizens who voted in favour of the Constitution declared spontaneously that they did so because they consider that the Constitution is essential in order to pursue European construction and 16% voted "yes" because they have always been in favour of European construction. This perception of the essential role of the Constitution in European construction seems to be more marked among the 18 to 24 year olds who voted "yes" (46%).

The next highest scores concerned strengthening the role of France within the European Union (12%) and strengthening the European Union vis-à-vis the United States (11%).

The other reasons mentioned spontaneously by "yes" voters ranked a lot further down, with scores of less than 10%. For example, 8% voted "yes" because they saw the Constitution as the first step towards political unification of Europe and 7% because they saw it as the first step towards a more social Europe.

2.3. What motivated people to vote NO

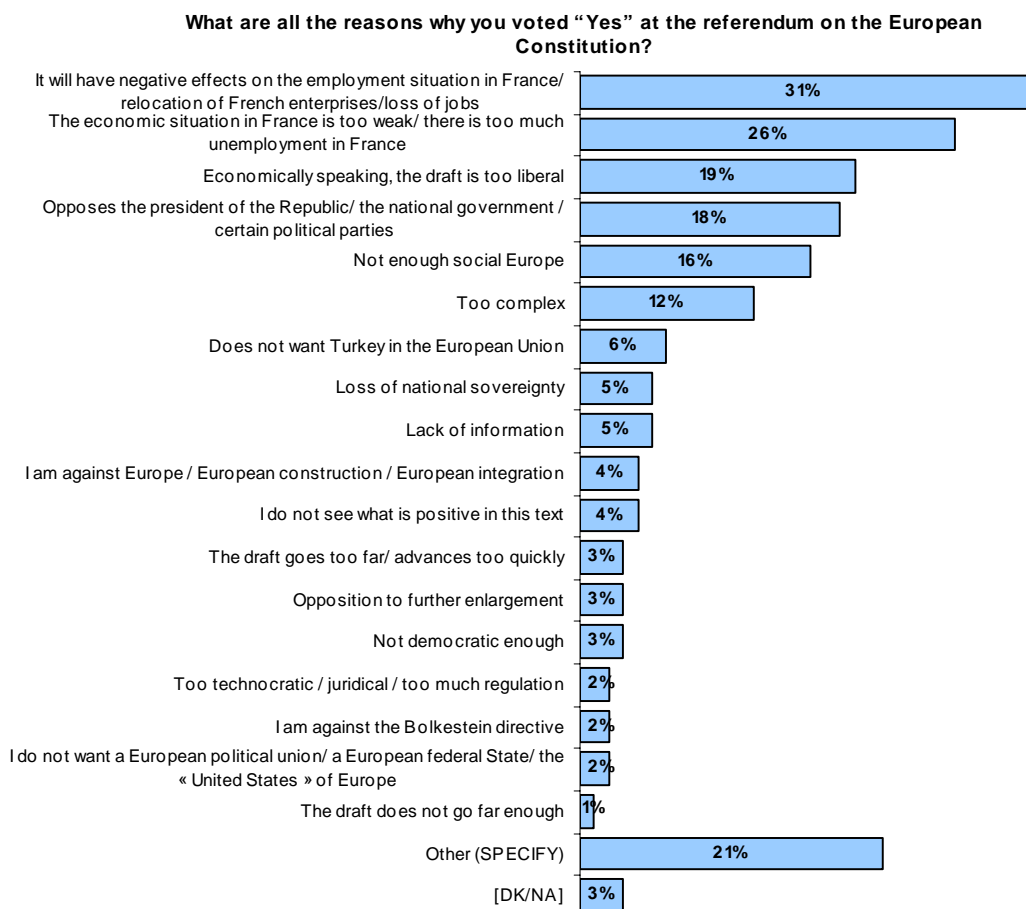

- The social concerns at the heart of the "no" vote -

The reasons why people voted "no" are more numerous and are based chiefly on **national and/or social themes** which take precedence over European considerations. "No" voters gave as the reason for their vote the fact that in their opinion the Constitution would have negative effects on employment in France (31%), whose economic situation in terms of unemployment is already considered to be too high (26%). The 18-24 age group and the 40-54 age group who voted "no", manual workers and people living in rural areas tend to be more sensitive to the negative effects on employment. People aged over 40 and people without a professional activity are more likely to be motivated by France's poor economic situation together with the very high level of unemployment.

Reasons such as the fact that economically speaking the draft is seen as too liberal (19%) as well as the lack of social Europe (16%) are mentioned more by men and city-dwellers. Opposition to French political leaders was mentioned by 18% of "no" voters (21% among people aged over 40) and the complexity of the text by 12% of them.

Finally, the other reasons given for voting "no" obtained citation rates of less than 10%. It is noteworthy that the rejection of Turkey's membership of the EU was mentioned spontaneously by only 6% of people who voted "no".



The motivations of the "no" vote by socio-demographic variables

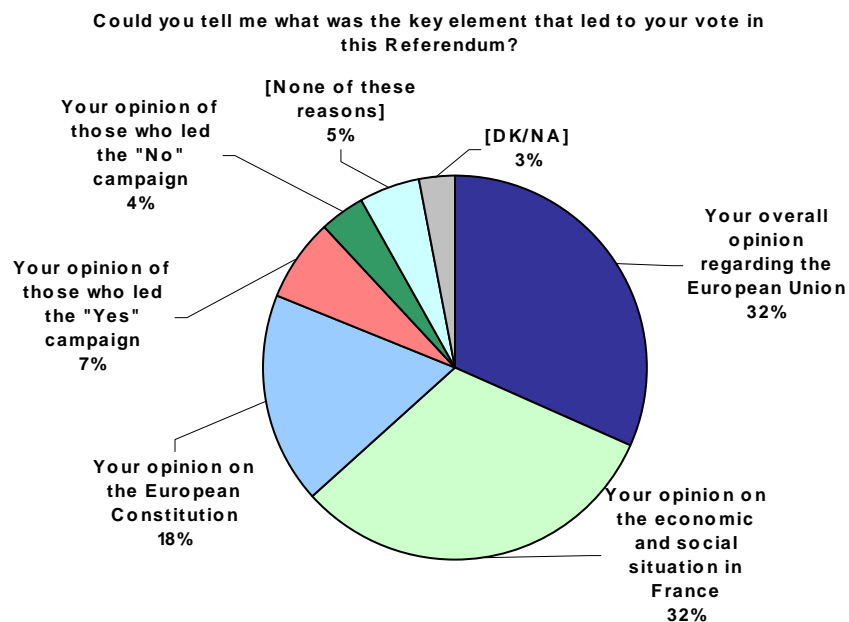

2.4. The key element that determined how people voted

Source questionnaire: Q7

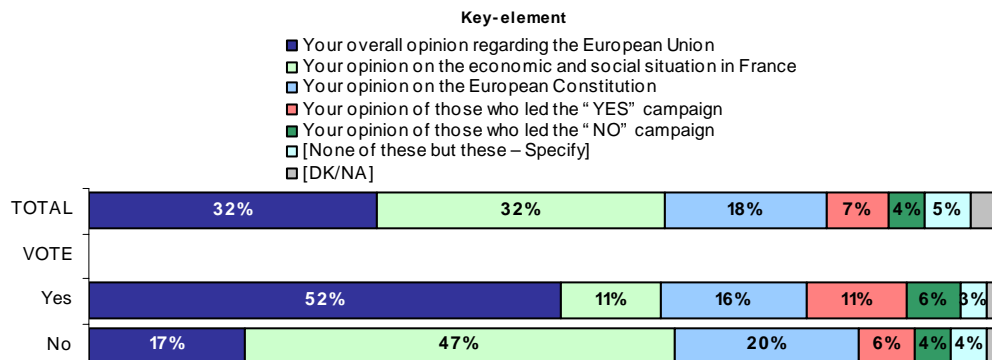
- The European aspect encouraged the "yes"» vote and the national aspect helped the "no" vote -

As regards the key element which determined how they voted at the referendum, French respondents are divided between their overall opinion regarding the European Union and their opinion on France's economic and social situation, with both proposals obtaining scores of 32%. In line with the results of the analysis of what motivated "yes" votes and "no" votes, there is once again a conflict between the European and national dimensions.



The majority of the "yes" supporters focused their decision on the European dimension (52%), while the "no" camp was more motivated by France's economic and social situation (47%).

Finally, the opinion on the actual text of the European Constitution motivated only the way in which a fifth of the "no" supporters voted (20%) and 16% of the "yes" supporters.



3. After 29 May – what next?

Regardless of whether or not they turned out to vote, respondents were asked, during this survey, to express their views on various post-referendum aspects: the stakes and consequences of the result for the European Union and for France, but also the future of the Constitution after its rejection by the French people.

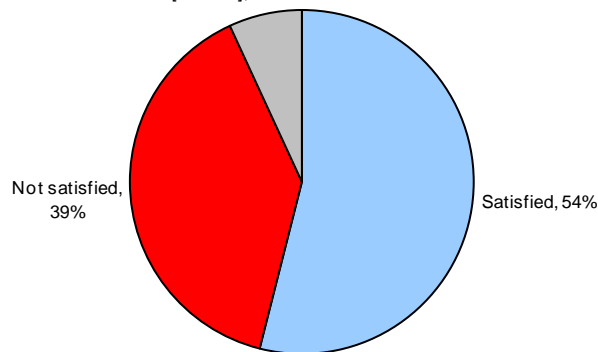
3.1. Satisfaction with the result

Source questionnaire: Q8

- A level of satisfaction in line with the victory of the "no" vote -

Regardless of whether or not they voted respondents were asked whether they were satisfied with the "no" victory. A majority of the persons interviewed declared that they were satisfied with the result (54%) while 39% were dissatisfied with it.

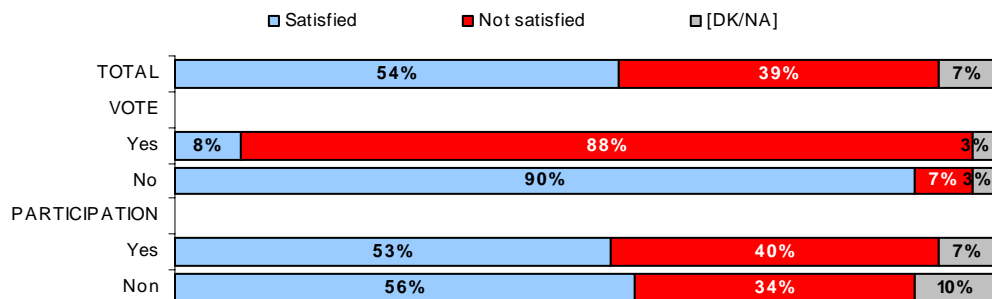
Regardless of whether or not you voted, are you satisfied with the « No » victory?

The "yes/no" division is fundamental in this case and influences the distribution of answers in the different socio-demographic categories. It is to be noted, however, that 8% of the French citizens who supported the Constitution indicated that they are satisfied with the "no" victory.

Moreover, 56% of those who abstained are satisfied with the result.

Regardless of whether or not you voted, are you satisfied with the « No » victory?



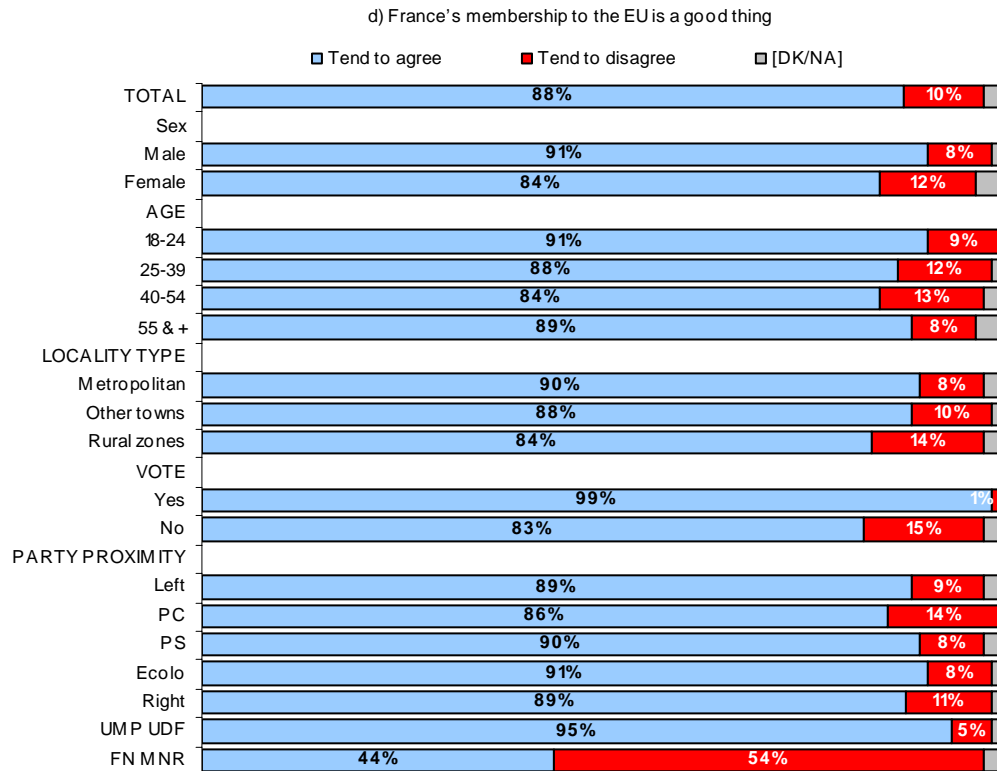
3.2. The stakes of the referendum for the European Union

Source questionnaire: Q10 d, j, a, f, h

- Almost nine in ten French citizens support France's membership of the European Union -

Despite the victory of the "no" vote, the French people do not call into question their country's membership of the European Union and 88% of respondents consider that France's membership of the EU is a good thing. This positive opinion is shared not only by all the "yes" supporters (99%) but also by the vast majority of the supporters of the "no" vote (83%).

Citizens close to the UMP and UDF parties tend to be more in favour of France's membership of the European Union (95%), as opposed to FN/MNR supporters, where the majority of them have a negative view of France's membership of the Union (54%).



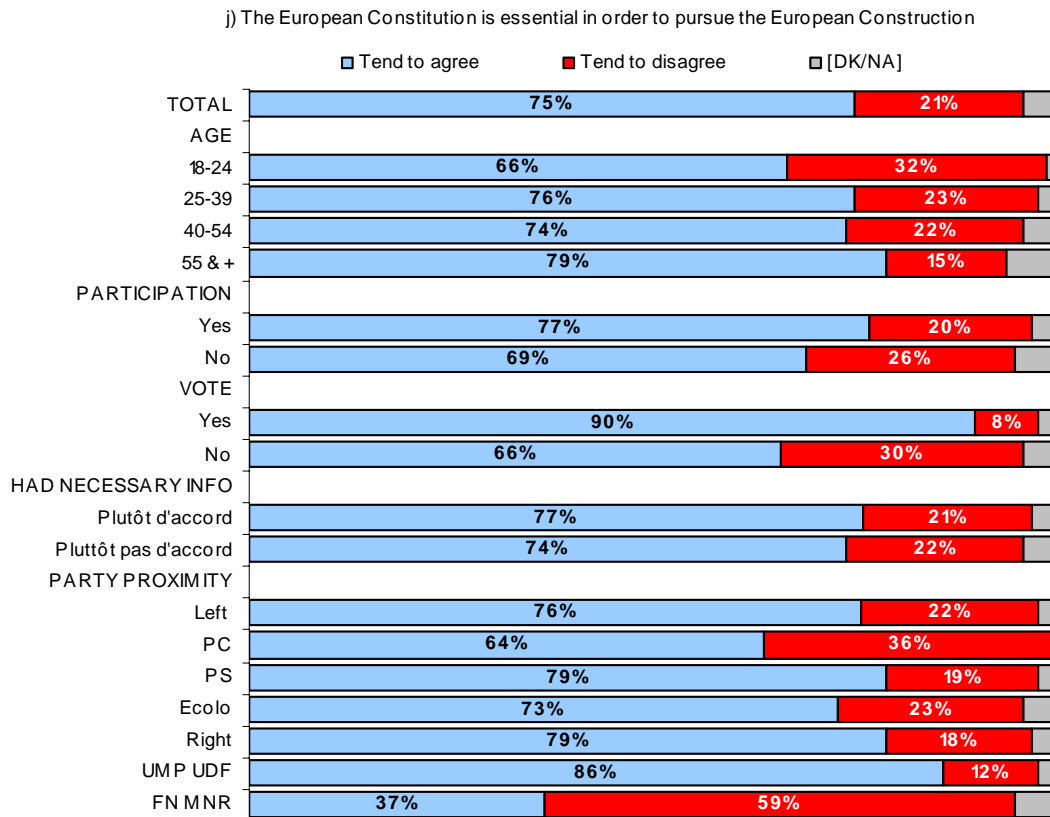
- The concept of the Constitution itself has not been rejected -

According to three quarters of respondents, the European Constitution is indispensable in order to pursue European construction (75%). This proposal is supported by 90% of "yes" voters, but also by 66% of "no" voters.

The oldest French citizens (55 and over) seem more aware of the fundamental importance of the European Constitution for the ongoing European Construction (79% versus 66% of the 18 to 24 age group).

Moreover, the indispensable nature of the Constitution is given considerably more recognition among citizens who voted in the referendum (90%) than among those who abstained (66%).

Finally, although there is more support among those close to the UMP/UDF parties for the indispensable aspect of European Constitution (86%), that opinion is not shared by supporters of the extreme right-wing parties (37%).

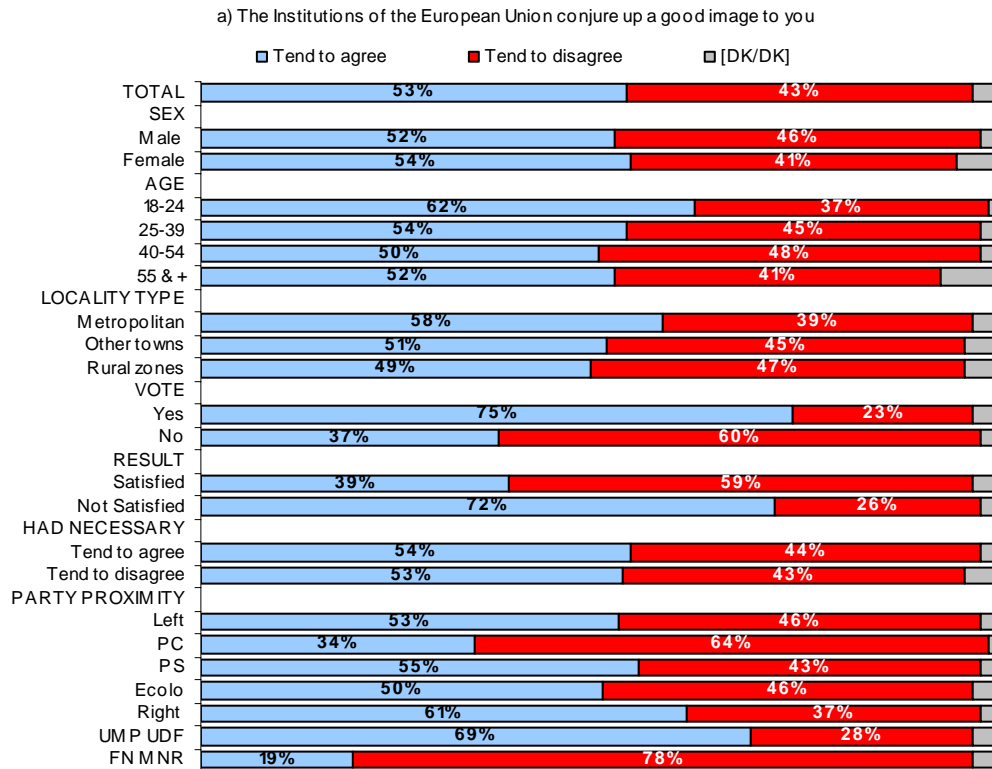


**- For most French people the
European institutions have a good image -**

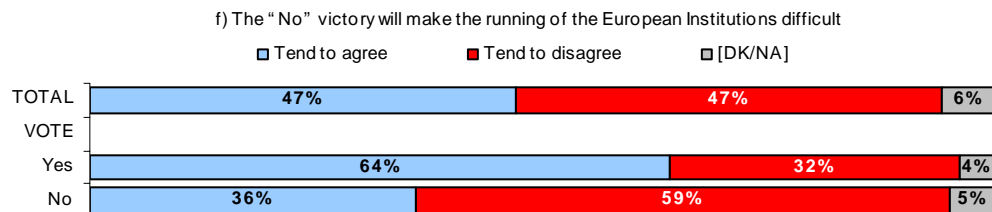
A majority of the French respondents interviewed on the day after the referendum consider that the European institutions have a good image (53%). That is particularly true among 18 to 24 year olds (62%) despite the fact that the majority of that age group was against the Constitution. The European institutions also conjure up a good image among people living in large urban centres (58%).

In addition, three quarters of the "yes" supporters answered positively (75%, compared with 37% among those who voted "no").

The political leanings of the French respondents also influence the distribution of answers: those close to the UMP/UDF parties are more inclined to consider that the European institutions have a good image (69%), unlike mainly extreme right-wing party supporters (19%) and those close to the CP (34%).



The French population seems more divided on the future functioning of the European institutions following the rejection of the Constitution: 47% of respondents consider that the "no" victory will make it more difficult and 47% believe the opposite. "Yes" supporters were more inclined to fear this scenario on the day after the "no" victory (64%).



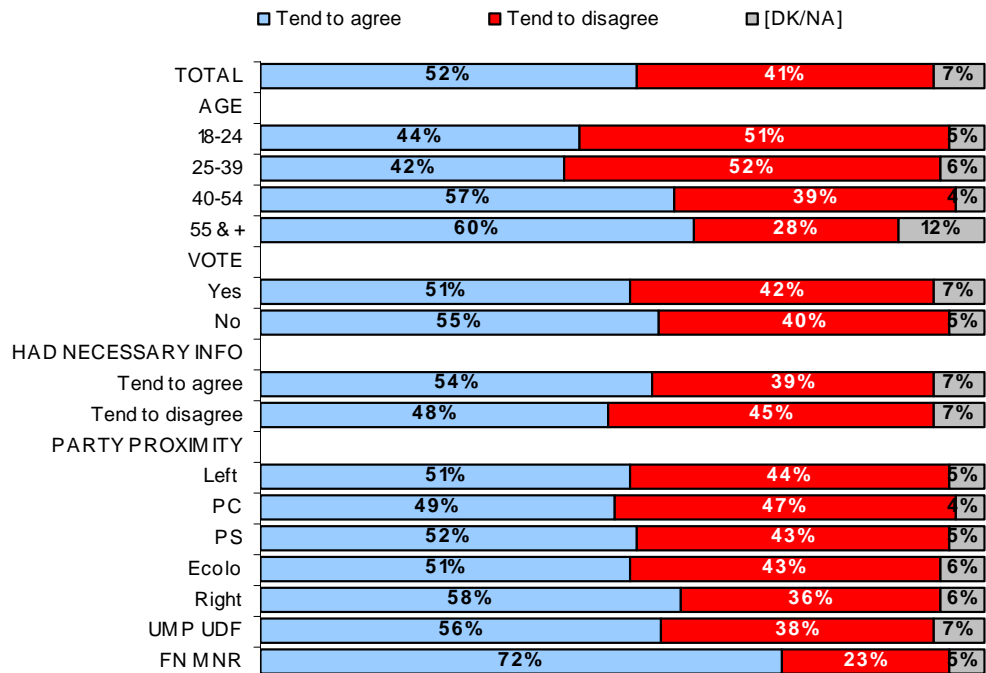
- The accession of new Member States will be more difficult following the "no" victory -

More than half of the French consider that the "no" victory will make the accession of new Member States more difficult (52%).

That opinion tends to be more marked among respondents aged over 40 (67% of the 40 to 54 age group and 60% of those aged 55 and over), as well as among those close to the FN/MNR (72%) and to a lesser extent among "no" voters (55%, a differential of 4 points compared with "yes" voters).

In addition, more respondents who declared that they had sufficient information to make their decision at the referendum believe that the accession of new Member States will be more difficult in the future (54%).

3.3. The consequences of the vote

3.3.1. Renegotiation of the text

Source questionnaire: Q10b, c

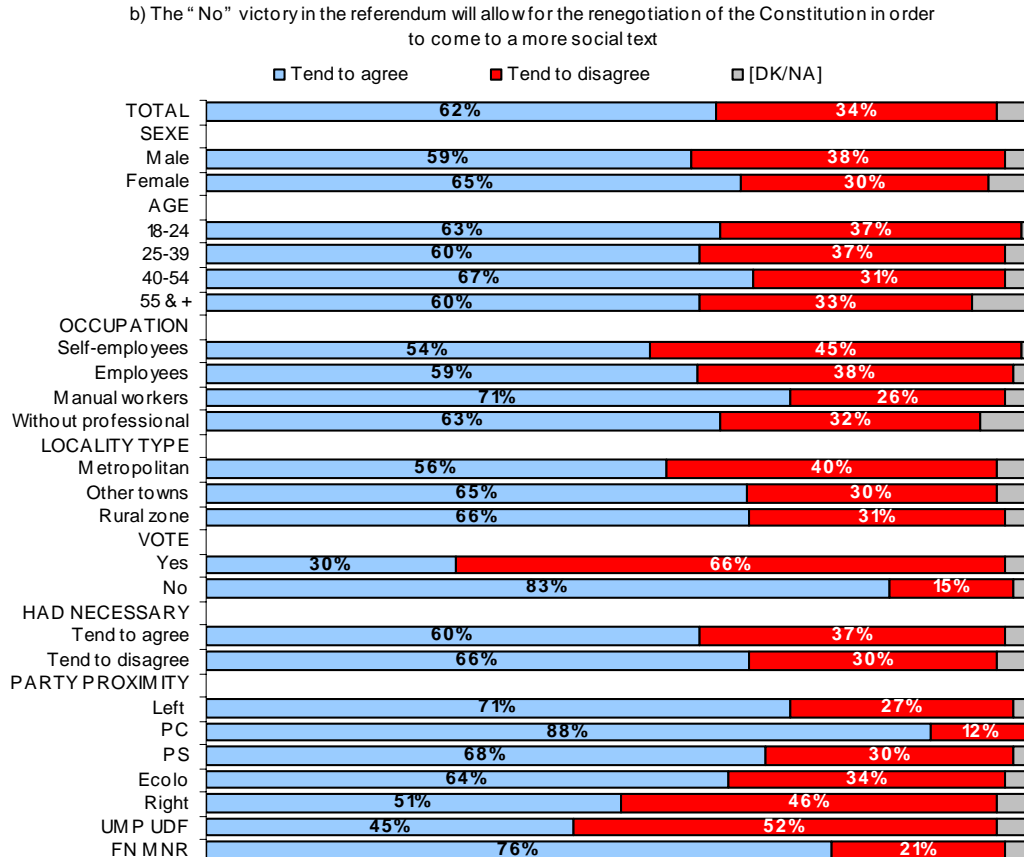
"No" voters believe in the possibility of the renegotiation of a more social Constitution -

More than six out of ten French people believe that the "no" victory will facilitate the renegotiation of the Constitution in order to achieve a more social text (62%). That opinion is more prevalent among women (65%), respondents aged between 40 and 54 (67%), manual workers (71%) and citizens living outside the major urban centres.

The division resulting from the vote is an important differentiation factor; 83% of "no" voters consider that it is now possible to renegotiate the Constitution in order to achieve a more social text, while only 30% of the "yes" voters share that opinion.

Those close to the CP and the FN/MNR, who voted overwhelmingly against the Constitution, are the most convinced of this possible renegotiation (88% and 76% respectively).

Finally, it is interesting to note that more citizens who declared that they had insufficient information to make a decision in the referendum believe that the "no" victory can open the way to a renegotiation of the Constitution with a more social text.



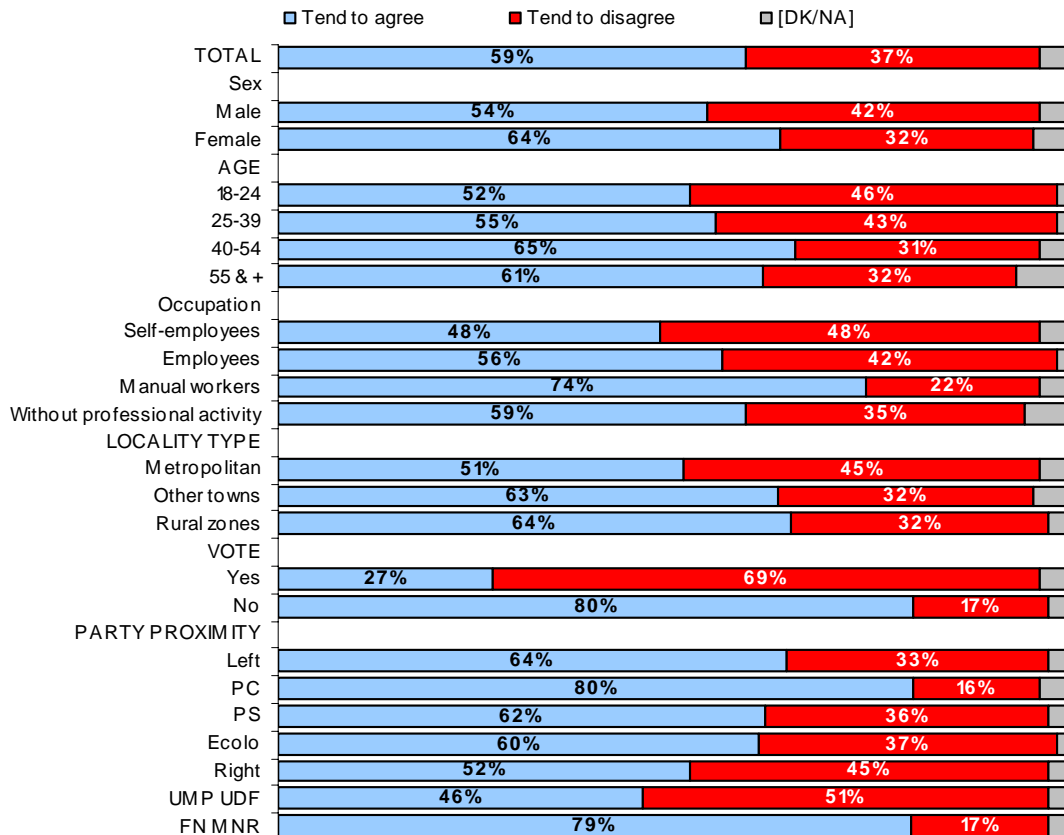
**- A new European Constitution could defend better
the interests of France -**

Almost six out of ten French respondents consider that the "no" victory will make it possible to renegotiate the Constitution in order to defend better French interests. (59%). This point of view tends to be more supported by women than men (64%).

Moreover, once again the same categories of persons envisage the renegotiation of the Constitution to come to a text that defends better French interests: citizens aged between 40 and 54, manual workers, people living outside the major urban centres and supporters of the CP and those close to the FN/MNR.

Once again, the division between electorates is fundamental: although 80% of "no" voters believe that a new text can be renegotiated that defends better the interests of France, only 27% of the "yes" voters are of the same opinion.

3.3.2. The influence of the French "no"

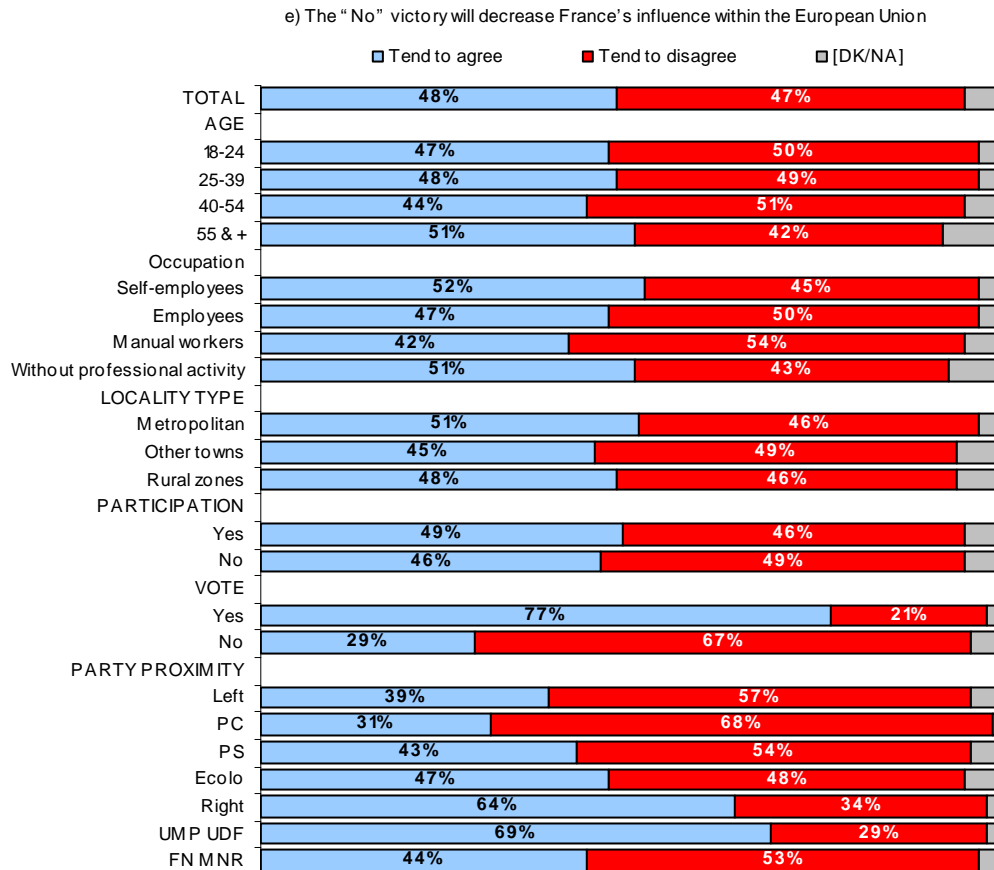

- "Yes" voters fear that France will lose its influence within the European Union -

French respondents are divided on the question of their country's influence within the European Union after their rejection of the European Constitution; 48% of the persons interviewed consider that the "no" vote will reduce France's influence within the European Union, while 47% believe the opposite.

Respondents who are close to the UMP/UDF parties tend to more afraid that France's position will be weakened (69%), as well as, to a lesser extent, people aged 55 and over (51%), self-employed people (52%) and people living in large cities (51%).

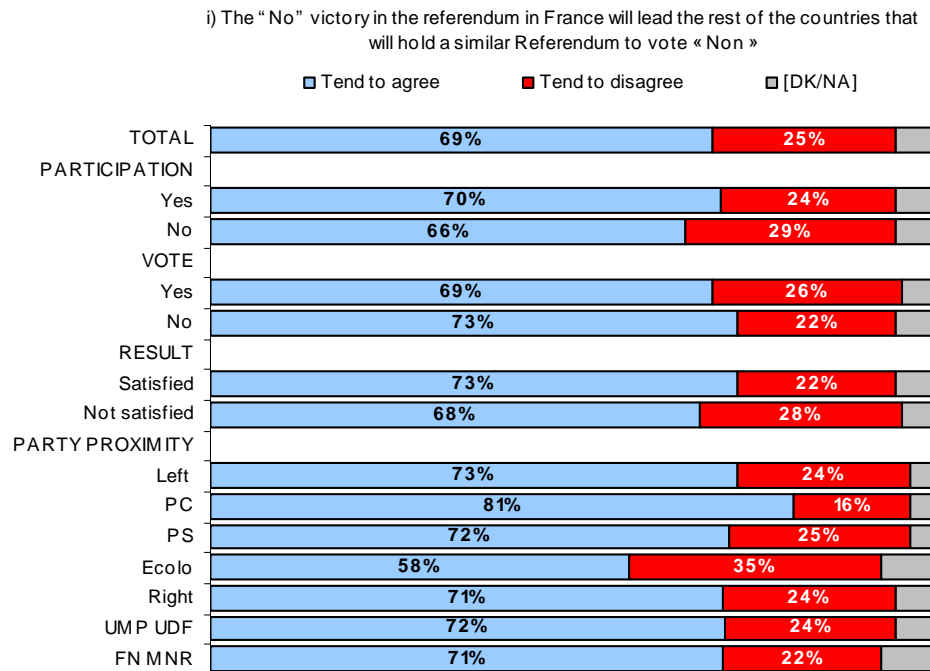
In addition, more than three quarters of voters having supported the Constitution are afraid of the negative consequences of the "no" victory on French influence within the European Union (77%).



**- The French believe that their choice will influence
the other Member States -**

69% of French citizens believe that the "no" victory in the French referendum will encourage other countries that hold a referendum on this issue to vote "no". That opinion is dominant in all the socio-demographic categories.

It is noteworthy, however, that more citizens having turned out to vote, "no" supporters, respondents satisfied with the result and those close to the CP anticipate such a "domino" effect. It should be borne in mind that the survey was carried out before the result of the Dutch referendum was known.



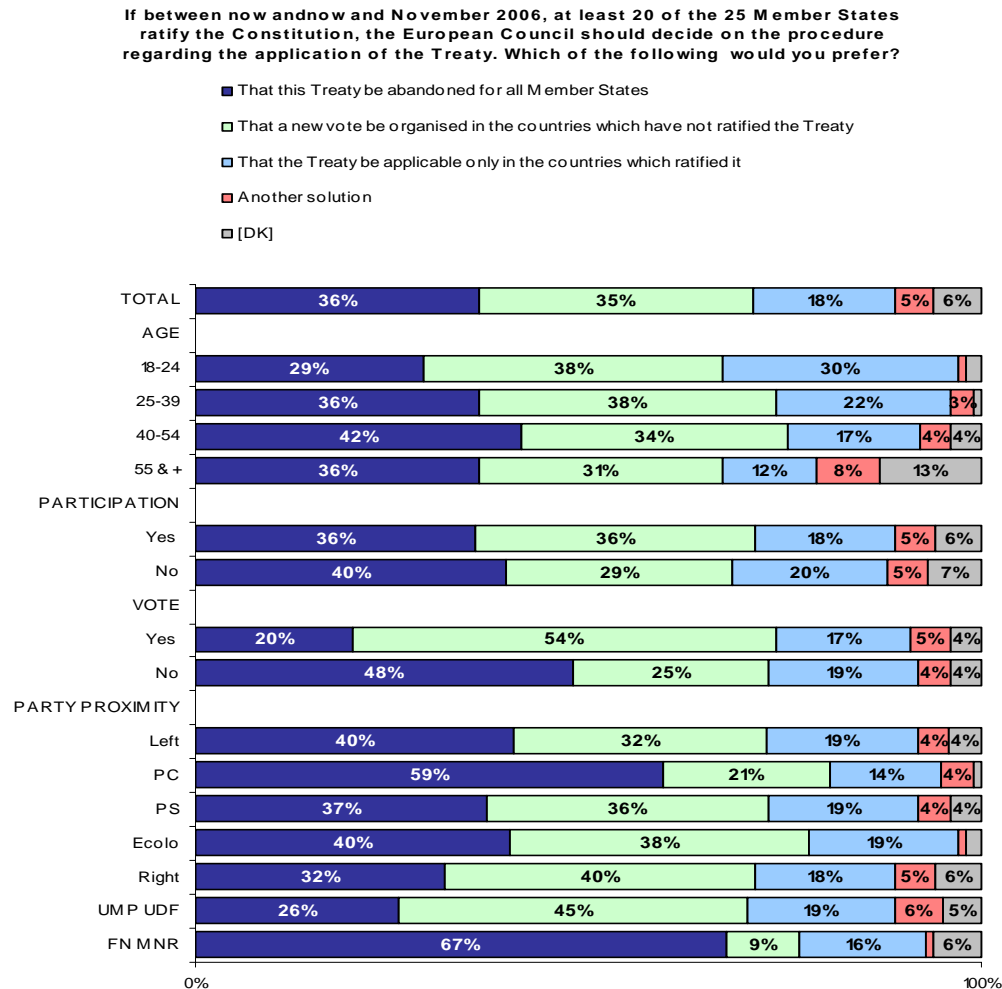
3.4. The future of the Constitution

Source questionnaire: Q11

- Abandoning the Constitution or a second chance -

Declaration 30 of the Constitution stipulates that "if, two years after the signature of the Treaty establishing a Constitution for Europe, four fifths of the Member States have ratified it and one or more Member States have encountered difficulties in proceeding with ratification, the matter will be referred to the European Council".

If the Constitution is ratified by at least 20 countries, 36% of French citizens would like to see the Constitution abandoned for all the Member States and 35% of French citizens would like a new vote to be organised in the countries that have not ratified the Constitution.



The idea of the Constitution being purely and simply abandoned seems to be the solution preferred by the French "no" voters (48%), citizens aged between 40 and 54 (42%) and those close to the FN/MNR (67%) or the CP (59%).

Logically, the idea of organising a new referendum appeals more to those who voted "yes" (54%) as well as UMP/UDF supporters (45%).

CONCLUSION

The issues at stake in this referendum on the ratification of the European Constitution in France clearly motivated the French and explain the turnout rate of 70%. Two thirds of the people interviewed in this post-referendum survey declared that they had **sufficient information to make a decision** at the time of the referendum. Moreover, almost four out of ten citizens consider that the **debates in the European Constitution** started at the right time (39%) but for others they started too late (37%).

Although the high turnout rate is comparable to that recorded for the referendum on the Maastricht Treaty in 1992, 30% of registered voters abstained on 29 may 2005. The **abstention level** in this referendum was highest among citizens aged under 40. The main reasons given by respondents for abstaining were, over and above **being prevented from voting by material reasons** (66%), **the complexity of the text** (60%) and **the lack of information** (49%). Only 14% of those who abstained explained their decision on the basis of their opposition to the **European Union** or European construction.

Support for the **"no"** vote, which carried the referendum with almost 55% of the votes cast, was most marked among French citizens aged between 40 and 54 (63%) or in the 18 to 24 age group (59%), people living outside the large urban centres (61% in rural areas and 59% in other towns) but above all among manual workers (76%) and even more strikingly among those close to the FN/ MNR (95%) and the CP (94%).

The main **motivation of the "yes"** lies in the perception of the pursuit of European construction being indispensable (39%) and in long-standing support for European construction (16%). The **reasons given for voting "no"** are far more diversified and are related to social concerns. Thus, "no" voters mentioned mainly the potentially negative effects of the Constitution on employment (31%), France's poor economic situation (26%), the perception of the Constitution as being too liberal from an economic point of view (19%), but also their opposition to the President of the Republic or the government (18%). More generally, the key element which motivated the majority of the "yes" supporters is their general view of the European Union, while a majority of these who voted "no" were guided by their view of France's economic and social situation.

Despite the "no" victory, French citizens are still in favour of the European Union and 88% of respondents consider that **France's membership of the European Union is a good thing**. That positive view is shared by not only all the "yes" supporters (99%) but also by a very large majority of the "no" voters (83%). In addition, three quarters of respondents declared that the **European Constitution is indispensable in order to pursue European construction** (75%). That proposal is supported by 90% of "yes" voters and 66% of "no" voters. Finally, the **European institutions conjure up a good image** for the majority of the persons interviewed (53%), but especially among those aged between 18 and 24 (62%), despite the fact that the majority of that age group rejected the Constitution.

The majority of French citizens believe that the "no" victory will allow a **renegotiation of the Constitution** in order, on the one hand, to come to a more social text (62%) and, on the other hand, to defend better the interests of France (59%).

French opinion seems to be divided on the question of the **reduction of France's influence** within the European Union: 48% of respondents seem certain that will be the case, while 47% do not think so. Finally, 52% of the people interviewed believe that the "no" victory will make it more difficult for **new countries to join the European Union**.

Conduction of this survey details

Statistical significance of the results

The results in a survey are valid only between the limits of a **statistical margin** caused by the sampling process. This margin varies with three factors :

1. The sample size (or the size of the analysed part in the sample) : the greater the number of respondents is, the smaller the statistical margin will be;
2. The result in itself : the closer the result approaches 50%, the wider the statistical margin will be ;
3. The desired degree of confidence: the more "strict" we are, the wider the statistical margin will be.

As an example, examine this illustrative case :

1. One question has been answered by 500 people ;
2. The analysed result is around 50%;
3. We choose a significance level of 95 % (it is the level most often used by the statisticians, and it is the one chosen for the Table hereafter);

In this illustrative case the statistical margin is: (+/- 4.4%) around the observed 50%. And as a conclusion: the result for the whole population lies between 45.6% and 54.4 %.

Hereafter, the statistical margins computed for various observed results are shown, on various sample sizes, at the 95% significance level.
